The number of citations of articles in our journal is currently high and our impact factor has increased from 0.7 to 1.1, which is a remarkable improvement for this 1-year period. This indicates that the popularity and interest for the field of dental traumatology is under rapid increase. I wish to thank all the authors, reviewers and readers for this great achievement in the field and for their contributions towards the improvement of our journal.
