Five years after the first edition, this new edition is a beautifully written and illustrated book bringing together all aspects of perioral bone biology into one 'must have' comprehensive text. The book covers everything from the history of guided bone regeneration to a really readable chapter on bone biology, a field that becomes more complex the more we discover about it. The colour clinical photographs and case studies with reference to modern biomaterials illustrate current state of the art diagnosis, imaging, and takes the clinician through the decision-making

process that leads to the optimum restorative treatment plan. A range and hierarchy of clinical complexity are described and operators should heed the advice to ensure the ideal restorative solution to truly interdisciplinary problems.

This book will be of great interest to those in the field of implant restoration, a field that engages many of the disciplines of dentistry and should be 'on the shelf' in every institution training the clinicians of the future.
