

This product is a DVD-based 'encyclopaedia and reference library'. The accompanying literature claims that '3D Head & Neck Anatomy for Dentistry is a stunning new 3D anatomy resource for dentists in training and practice providing an encyclopaedic image library and reference to enhance consultations, presentations, teaching, and study'. Well, we agree; it is very informative, the images are (for the most part) excellent and the instructions are easy to follow. It might be a cliché, but this format really does bring anatomy to life much better than any textbook of anatomy we have ever read, and the '3-D' aspect makes it much easier to relate the various structures/tissues and organs to the clinical situation. Some minor quibbles; the authentication process required several attempts and a few of the images (out of very many) were blurred - they looked like stills captured from clinical video. It isn't cheap, but it is a 'must have' for a dental school or postgraduate deanery library.
