This website is sponsored by the UNC School of Medicine and includes the following sections: (i) Professional Education, (ii) Curriculum Development, (iii) Faculty Development, (iv) Student Training and (v) Demo Sites. The Professional Education section lists and describes conferences and workshops on aging that are available. It also provides online education about HIV/AIDS and Older Adults as well as two online interactive cases. A list of online resources is also available.

The section on Curriculum Development provides links to many other websites, particularly within the UNC School of Medicine and the UNC Center for Aging and Health.
