Her contribution has moved the profession in a very positive direction, and her contribution to research has broadened our knowledge extensively, for example her presentations on ISDH meetings about evidence-based practice, scoping reviews and secondary analysis. Since 2011, she was also a member of the Editorial Board of the IJDH. As such, she always performed excellent reviews, very thorough and precise in time, which helped the authors to improve the manuscripts, resulting in better publications. Dr. Cobban was a great role model for any researcher and any Dental Hygienist. We have lost a great colleague, and our thoughts are with Dr. Cobbans' family and friends.
