Dentaid ... helping the children of the Ukraine

The specialist charity, Dentaid, refurbishes donated equipment from UK dentists into complete dental surgeries for charitable clinics in the developing world. Since 1996, the charity has sent surgeries to 40 countries on five continents. Back in 1998, Dentaid, in partnership with Hope Now (a Christian humanitarian charity working in the Ukraine and South Africa), took a team of plumbers, engineers, electricians, dentists and decorators to install seven dental surgeries in three hospitals in the area around Cherkassy.

This support was followed in 2002 by a large mobile dental surgery, driven overland to provide medical and dental services to the orphans and deprived villagers in the rural areas of Cherkassy Province. This vehicle has been manned by volunteer dentists and was recently taken on a visit to two rural Youth Camps where, working from the mobile dental unit, children, as well as staff and villagers, were examined and treated. As this was the first season of active service for the mobile, many aspects were an unknown quantity, and disposables had to be taken by air in personal baggage. The scant information gleaned from the literature and previous volunteers indicated that caries levels would be high, as dental services in Ukraine had declined since the country's independence in 1991. As expected the dentists were inundated with work from the first moment. They had excellent young interpreters from Hope Now, and throughput was

greatly facilitated by simple medical history forms, previously translated into Ukrainian, which doubled as consent forms for unaccompanied children. Of 181 children examined 12% were caries-free. 82% of 5–10-year-olds had caries in the primary dentition and 100% of 15-year-olds had caries in their permanent teeth. The cavities were large and many teeth unsaveable. With limited time and resources, treatment options were few. Patients in pain were the first priority, moving on to those for whom simple conservation or fissure sealants would be of longterm benefit. There were many requests for restoration of fractured central incisors. Adult patients proved even more challenging with many having gold or stainless steel restorations from the Soviet era with advanced secondary caries. Regretfully, many had to be turned away. Although the volunteers recognized that their contribution was

'a tiny drop in the immense ocean of disease in Ukraine' another visit is planned for August 2004 when it is hoped to employ a Ukrainian dentist to work in the mobile surgery in various locations. An Oral Health education programme is also to be introduced into the orphanages.

In February 2004, Integrated Dental Holdings, the largest owner of dental practices in the UK, made a donation of over 17 000 toothbrushes to Dentaid. These will be put to use in Dentaid's prevention programmes and the first consignment will be to the Hope Now orphanages in Ukraine.

Dr Ramón Castillo - Mercado

Paediatric Dentist Elected President of the International College of Dentists

On 1 January 2004, Dr Ramón Castillo took over the World Presidency of the International College of Dentists. Dr Castillo was elected by unanimous vote at the International College of Dentists' Annual

World Council meeting which took place in Sydney, Australia, on 16 and 17 September 2003. Dr Castillo serves as a university professor in Lima, Peru.

The International College of Dentists is a prestigious, non-profit making international honorary dental institution. Membership, by invitation only, is currently held by 9980 members in 89 countries.

The International College of Dentists was set up in 1920, in Tokyo, Japan by Dr Tsurukich Okumura (Japan) and Louis Ottofy (USA) and the organization was formally founded in 1927. Dr Ramón Castillo's presidency is the first for a South American dentist, it is an honor and a significant challenge for the South American Section of the College.

Dr Castillo qualified from Universidad de San Marcos, Lima, Peru and holds a Master of Science degree in Paediatric Dentistry from the University of Rochester, USA. He is a certified Specialist in Paediatric Dentistry and is one of the founding professors of the *Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia* College of Dentistry and its past Dean.
