I appreciate the amount of time that our reviewers are able to provide. Despite other responsibilities, they find the time to assist me with a timelier decision for the authors.

With last year's 228 new submissions, this improvement could not have occurred without their help. I am looking forward to the Academy's 2008 Annual Session to meet all of the new and old reviewers and thank them in person (not just via the list published in the Sept./Dec. issue of the journal) for helping me so much during the past two years.

IngentaConnect, the company that hosts the journal, reported that the IDQ made their top list of full text downloads in 2007! Also, IDC ranked 83rd with 1168 full text downloads and 94th with 1738 home page views for the period of December 1, 2007, to December 31, 2007.

Soon it well be time for the 61<sup>st</sup> meeting of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry in Washington, D.C., and I am looking forward to better weather than what Chicago is able to offer to us at the moment. As usual we will have a meeting of the editorial board and I hope you will be able to attend. I also hope to meet some more members willing to help in the effort to improve the JDQ and provide me with suggestions and comments. There is always room for improvement, and I would like to hear your ideas.
