
All too frequently, continuing education programs today are peppered with commercially biased, selfserving lecturers bent on championing concepts that promote "instant dentistry" and maximized profits while ignoring the long-term health implications for the patient. Ethical teachers who foster concepts based on scientific evidence and conservation are unfortunately becoming increasingly scarce. The contemporary "educator" frequently takes an apprentice-based approach: "Do it the way I do, and you will be successful" is the contemporary mantra we hear time and again.

In an attempt to stem this unsettling tide of commercialism and "quick fix" dentistry, the American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry (AAED) elected to use its collective expertise to provide an annual forum for high-quality, evidence-based continuing education. To that end, the annual Esthetic and Restorative Update (ERU) was implemented. For the first time, any interested dental professional can attend an annual educational forum constituted by AAED fellows who will share cutting-edge information on a broad range of interdisciplinary esthetic and restorative topics. These presenters represent the most highly recognized and sought-after speakers in the profession today.

It is quite possible that you know very little about the AAED. Founded in 1975 by Dr. Ronald Goldstein and the late Dr. Charles Pincus, the AAED is a small organization composed of distinguished dental professionals from virtually every facet of the profession. The founders' vision was to bring together a diverse group of qualified, talented individuals who share a common interest in the emerging field of dental esthetics and the promotion of excellence in total patient care. All speakers are members of the AAED who donate their time and expertise to ensure the success of this effort. The first ERU was held this past year in Seattle, WA, and the response by the attendees was overwhelmingly positive.

The AAED is proud to have set the standards in the field of dental esthetics for the past three decades. Through the years, its hallmark has been the advancement of clinical excellence and high ethical stan-

dards. We urge you to join in our continuing commitment to better dentistry and to stem the tide of commercialism and overtreatment of the public. The AAED invites you and your colleagues to join us in Orlando, FL, on April 8 and 9, 2005, for the "Esthetic and Restorative Update 2005" to learn the most current information from the most respected educators in dentistry. Our noted panel of speakers will include Drs. Vincent Celenza, Gerard Chiche, Gordon Christensen, Mark Friedman, Cary Goldstein, Gregory Kinzer, Vincent Kokich Ir, Baldwin Marchack, Daniel Nathanson, Dennis Shanelec, Frank Spear, and John West. We believe you will find this meeting educational, refreshing, and highly informative.
