

New ABP Examiner Announced



The Members of the Council for the American Board of Prosthodontics are pleased to announce that Dr. Jonathan P. Wiens has been elected as the new examining member of the American Board of Prosthodontics (ABP).

Dr. Jonathan P. Wiens received his Bachelor's degree from Eastern Michigan University and D.D.S. magna cum laude from the University of Detroit in 1973. He completed prosthodontic advanced training in fixed and removable prosthodontics and maxillofacial prosthetics at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in 1979 and received a M.S. degree. He achieved Diplomate status of

the American Board of Prosthodontics in 1982 and ABP recertification in 2004.

Dr. Wiens is a Fellow and Treasurer of the American College of Prosthodontists and President of the Academy of Prosthodontics, as well as Past-president of the American Academy of Maxillofacial Prosthetics. He was elected into Omicron Kappa Upsilon honor society and is the recipient of the S.G. Applegate Award for outstanding achievement in Prosthodontics and the Paul S. Crosby Award for outstanding achievement in Operative Dentistry. He maintains a private practice in West Bloomfield, Michigan, is a Clinical Professor at the University of Detroit Mercy and is attending staff at the Craniofacial Institute at Providence Hospital, Southfield, Michigan. Clinical research areas of interest have resulted in publications in trauma, quality of life, occlusion, craniofacial and dental implants as well as maxillofacial materials.

The success of the election process is based on broad participation by the Diplomates of the American Board of Prosthodontics. The right to vote for the new examining member of the ABP is one of the key privileges of becoming a Diplomate of the specialty. The Council will continue to work on behalf of the specialty to search and help identify the best possible candidates for the American Board of Prosthodontics. The Council has an obligation to pursue new examiners for the American Board of Prosthodontics and remain attentive when considering the demographics of our specialty as represented in the diversity of all Prosthodontists. These goals reflect the mission statement of the ACP and reflect the goals and objectives of the American Board of Prosthodontics Examiners.
