

Tips for Authors: Book Reviews

Occasionally, the *Journal of Prosthodontics (JOPR)* publishes reviews of new books of interest to prosthodontists. Although *JOPR* book reviews are generally invited submissions, suggestions for books to be reviewed are welcomed.

In addition to topics relating specifically to prosthodontics, readers of the *JOPR* may also be interested in learning about new books that address such related disciplines as dental materials, pharmaceuticals, handling medical emergencies, oral complications of systemic diseases that have an impact on prosthodontic treatment, as well as practice management and legal issues relating to liability and malpractice suits.

The qualifications of a potential reviewer are considered by the *JOPRs* book review editor in selecting an individual to evaluate a new publication. This individual must be familiar with the literature of the area to which the new book belongs so that the new publication can be considered in the context of previously published work. The objective reviewer will not have any associations or conflicts of interest that might compromise his or her objectivity.

The review begins with the details of publication: title, author or editor, publisher, date of publication, number of pages, type, and extent of illustrations. The price of the book may also be reported. Where does the book fit in the literature? Is it a new work or a new edition of an old standard? What are the author or editor's qualifications for addressing the subject?

The reviewer describes the book's contents, its scope. This discussion will not simply list the book's contents but rather will provide an overview and evaluation of the material. Is there a knowledge gap the book is intended to fill? Does the book successfully meet that need? In addition, any special features such as diagrams or notable illustrations or a comprehensive bibliography are described. Equally important, the reviewer will note and document any deficiencies or important omissions in the work.

Finally, it should be noted that although, as noted above, the reviewer must be an objective reader and must not have a personal stake in the reviewed book's success, authors or editors of new publications are welcome to call the attention of the *JOPR* editorial staff to their work and suggest that it be considered for review. Additionally, if you are interested in reviewing books for the *JOPR*, please let us know. You may be interested to know that book review authors are allowed to keep the text they review!
