The American Dental Association's Principles of Ethics and Code of Professional Conduct state that emergency care is an essential duty of every dentist.¹ A dentist who accepts an infant, child, or adolescent as a patient of record shall make reasonable arrangements for emergency oral/dental care, along with providing instructions to the parent for accessing emergency care. When consulted in an emergency by patients not of record, the dentist should make reasonable arrangements for emergency care.
