The Dental Executive Director supervises approximately 40 personnel in a five-clinic, 30-chair clinical program that targets Medicaid children as well as adult members of the County Health Care Taxing District entitlement program. Our Public Health Dentistry Division administers a community-based fluoridation initiative, and school-based fluoride mouthrinse (40,000 children) and sealant (2,000 children) programs.
