Tremendous advances in the field of laser dentistry have occurred since the subject was last visited by the *Dental Clinics of North America*. Four years ago, dentists were just beginning to discover the usefulness of the erbium family of lasers on hard tissue. Today, those instruments are used for osseous surgeries and apicoectomies and for operative dentistry on deciduous and permanent teeth. More laser companies are entering the field, offering the profession more choices, including more laser tips and similar accessories for performing more procedures than ever before. Laser dentistry, formerly embraced only by the specialty of oral and maxillofacial surgery, has been the subject of a favorable position paper by a blue-ribbon panel of the American Academy of Periodontology.
